VIA follows official authority guidelines

Before your study start and presence on campus, you must know that VIA, in the current situation with coronavirus, follows the guidelines of the health authorities in order to minimize the risk of spreading infection.

Concretely, we avoid hugs and handshakes, keep our distance, ask everyone to be diligent with hand washing and/or hand sanitizer, do extra cleaning and have introduced special procedures regarding the food in the canteen. A few activities in e.g. workshops will be carried out with facemasks, which we will provide for you. In addition, we ask all students and employees to stay home and be tested if having the slightest symptoms of COVID-19.

Dispensers with hand sanitizer and posters with guidelines in relation to coronavirus are placed at all teaching locations. Signs have been put up at all class rooms, auditoriums, workshops, canteens, etc. with the number of people allowed in the room at the same time.

At VIA's locations in Aarhus and Silkeborg, there are stricter guidelines due to the current outbreaks there.

In other words, you can be completely confident that we at VIA safeguards your health – while providing a good study start and educational teaching spearheaded by with skilled lecturers.

We hope that you also contribute with solidarity and help minimize the risk of spreading infection!
