

Notification on the processing of personal information regarding self-swabbing under supervision

The purpose and basis for processing your personal information

It is a condition of physical attendance at VIA that students and staff must be able to document a negative COVID-19 test that is no more than 72 hours old. The purpose of the test requirement is to reduce the risk of COVID-19 spreading.

It is VIA's task to check whether the student or staff member can present a valid negative test. In response to this, VIA is offering a rapid test in the form of self-swabbing under supervision.

Your consent for you being examined for COVID-19 by self-swabbing

It is a condition for VIA examining you for COVID-19 by supervised self-swabbing with a rapid test that you voluntarily participate in this and, thereby, have given your consent to be tested for COVID-19. VIA considers your involvement in being rapid-tested for COVID-19 an adequate and informed consent to do so.

What information is processed?

When you carry out a rapid test, VIA is responsible for the processing of the personal information, which you provide in connection with the test. This means that VIA is responsible for the processing of your personal information in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation.

The following information is processed in connection with the rapid test: Name, CPR number, phone number and test results. A test result can be positive, negative or inconclusive.

The basis for the processing of the personal information in question can be found in Article 6 1 (e) (Article 6 1 (f) in the case of private institutions) and Article 9 2 (g) of the General Data Protection Regulation as well as Section 7 (4) of the Danish Data Protection Act. This should be viewed in light of the fact that the processing of the data is necessary to carry out the regulatory task assigned to VIA.

Who is the information passed on to?

Your CPR number and test result will be reported to the Danish Health Data Authority, which uses the information to monitor the course of infection in Denmark.

Should you test positive for COVID-19, the result will be passed on to the Danish Patient Safety Authority along with information on your name, CPR number and phone number for contract tracing.

When will the information be deleted?

VIA will delete your information once it has been reported to the Danish Health Data Authority.
