Introduction to the Danish admission system Applications to higher education programmes in Denmark are coordinated centrally through the national admission website: <u>www.optagelse.dk</u>.

IMPORTANT DATES SET BY THE MINISTRY OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND SCIENCE



1 February - 15 March at 12.00 noon **Optagelse.dk** open for applications

- Send a signature page for each application
- The signature page will be generated on optagelse.dk after finishing the digital application. You must print it, sign it, and send it to <u>apply@via.dk</u> before 15 March, 12.00 noon.
- State which programme you have applied for in the subject line of the email.
- Apply at www.optagelse.dk well before this date to avoid any queue (Especially for TAW with the portfolio)
- Make sure to register on time, even if there are still documents missing to complete your application

Take your time and start well ahead of the deadline

15 March at 12.00 noon Application deadline

You may add attachments after the application deadline within the time limit given in our messages sent to you through nemStudie.dk.

This could be a diploma, if you finish your Upper Secondary Education after 15 March or documentation for English proficiency

Please note that TAW require that you produce a **portfolio** and attach it to your application before the application deadline 15 March 12.00 noon.

Applications received after the deadline are not accepted.

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5 July at 12.00 noon- Deadline for uploading final documentation

On <u>www.optagelse.dk</u> you can :

- Delete applications
- Change list of priorities Please inform <u>apply@via.dk</u> if changes of priorities are made, as this will not happen automatically (send screenshot)
- Apply for a standby place
- Upload final documentation

If you do not receive your Upper Secondary School Certificate and final transcript of records till after 5 July you may expect a rejection of your application and instead look out for available study places on 26 July.

We have to send in all our assessments of our applications to the Coordinated Admission so they can have their decision ready for 26 July. For this reason we are **not able to extend the deadline** further than 5 July.

For IB Diplomas we are able to attain these from Ibo.org as soon as they are registered.

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26 July - nationwide date for responding to applicants that have applied for a higher education programme in Denmark

You will only receive **response from one place.** Either you will receive a letter from VIA University College with an offer for a study place/ standby place or you will receive a rejection letter from the coordinating authority.

You will not receive a letter from each of your priorities.

Confirming your offer

You must submit your answer at nemStudie.dk in the end of July. The specific date and procedure will be indicated in the admission letter.

If you are not admitted to any of the programmes that you have applied for you may have a possibility to **apply for an available study place**. We open up for available study places on 26 July on our website.

4. Attachments:

Name the files e.g., Motivational letter, Certificate

Documentation and attachments must be uploaded and added to each application by ticking the box next to each application in the section "attachments" at optagelse.dk.

✓ Documentation for Upper Secondary Education (if finishing this summer and you are yet to receive your certificate then make sure to upload transcript of records including all exam grades)

- \checkmark Documentation for final transcript of records
- ✓ Documentation for hours obtained in relevant subjects Verification form
- ✓ Documentation for English Proficiency
- ✓ Documentation of citizenship

✓ Documentation for the set criteria's relevant for the specific programme. E.g. Workexperience,

courses or motivational letter/video (Engineering, ATCM)

5. Sign & submit

Sign the application:

-If you apply with Danish CPR / MitID, your application is signed digitally.

-If you apply without Danish CPR/ MitID, you must conclude the application by printing the "Signature page"(a receipt slip, containing a 10-digit application ID number) and email it to us at <u>apply@via.dk</u>

State which programme you have applied for in the subject line of the email. Remember to forward the Signature page before the March 15 deadline (11:59 am) to each of the programmes you are applying to

English proficiency requirement

All applicants must meet the English proficiency requirement.

The English proficiency requirement can be met by documenting one of the below:

Upper Secondary School:

min. 210 hours, 1 hour = 60 minutes during the final three years in Upper Secondary School. A verification form may be used

An internationally recognized language test

IELTS (Academic) (also online) with a minimum average score of 6.5
TOEFL (iBT) Internet-based or Home Edition with a score of at least 83
One of the following Cambridge English tests with an average score of at least 180 (C1-level):

- C1 Advanced (former Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE))
- C2 Proficiency (former Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE)

Book an English test (if needed) early in the admissions process. Please state on the application form if the English test has been booked and when you expect to pass it.

Note that the IELTS and TOEFL test result must be no more than two years old

English as a specific admission requirement

Some programme's also have English as a specific admission requirement

Software Technology Engineering and Climate & Supply Engineering

English B (210 hours, last three years of Upper Secondary School
1 hour = 60 minutes

Design Technology and Business and Architectural Technology and Construction Management

English C (75 hours, last three years of Upper Secondary School 1 hour = 60 minutes

Verification Form

To document the specific admission requirements, we advise you to use the verification form

Verify the hours of instruction to compare to Danish Levels. Find required levels on each programme webpage

State the lenght of instruction hour.

State the grade for the last year

The Verification Form must be signed and stamped by the Educational institution

Because of the high number of very qualified applicants and our limited study places, we unfortunately must reject qualified applicants.

You are welcome to join a online feedback session for all applicants who did not pass the portfolio assessment. The rejection letter will include a link to this session

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Bachelor in Animation Admission test and interview Individual online admission test: May 6 or 7, 2024 In person admission interviews in Viborg, Denmark: May 13 – 17, 2024.

> - If you are prevented in coming to Viborg we can arrange an online interview, but we highly recommend doing the interview in-person.

End May/ start June,

You will be informed individually whether you passed the admission test and interview or not through nemStudie.dk A passed admission test and interview does not guarantee final admission.

Criterias: Engineering and Architectural Technology and Construction Management

Once you fulfill all entry requirements you will be assessed on different criterias

- Applicants are screened on grades, workexperince and motivational letter- see each programme webpage
- Make sure to upload relevant documentation for the criterias set by the programme
- For the Engineering programmes you must upload a motivational letter in form of a 3 min. video- Link to video on a seperate document
- For the Architectural Technology and Construction Management programme you must upload a motivational letter

Standby list

What is the stand-by list?

- The stand-by list is a waiting list through which VIA's programmes offer study places in cases where there are available study places on 26 July and uptill shortly after study start.
- An available study place can occur in the case of a withdrawal from an applicant.
- If not offered an available study place within a deadline set by the programme your stand-by place will be converted to a guaranteed study place for next year.

How to apply for the stand-by list? You tick the stand-by box on the application.

If you change your mind regarding applying for a standby place you may **notify the admissions office** by writing to us through nemStudie.dk no later than 5. July 12.00 noon.

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Stand-by list

Why should you apply for the stand-by list?

- Because you are certain that this is the programme -that you wish to be admitted to.
- It will improve your chances of admission

What to be aware of once you are offered a stand-by place

- First of all you have to accept the stand-by place within the deadline if offered on 26. July.
- If an available study place occur, you must be available on phone and check nemStudie.dk as you receive the offer here.
- If not responding within the deadline you lose the spot on the stand-by list and the offer will go to the next person on the stand-by list.
- If declining the offer for a study place you will lose the spot on the standby list and you must reapply the following year

Set the browser language to English

nemStudie.dk – Communication channel

- Once applying you receive an email with a link to log in to nemStudie.dk Check spamfilter if not received in your inbox.
- Log in to nemStudie by using the email address used when applying through optagelse.dk. If already having a MitID you may use this when logging in.
- Follow the status of your application(s) after applying through www.optagelse.dk
- Receive messages regarding your application(s) from the Admissions Office
- Contact the Admissions Office through nemStudie.dk with questions and comments regarding the assessment of your application(s)

IMPORTANT ! Check nemStudie regularly

Information for Non-EU applicants

Deadline for payment of Tuition Fee: 15 May 2024 and 1 June for TAW and Design-Top Up

Application process for VISA:

- The Admissions office initiate the application for residence permit and forward the applicant a password in order to fill in part 2 and attach all the documentation required by SIRI
- > The VISA application may take up to **60 days to process**
- Note, that the application is only open for 30 days so it is important to fill in part 2 as soon as possible after receiving the passwords from the Admissions Office
- Forward the VISA decision to <u>apply@via.dk</u>
- If the VISA decision is not received in time for study start, please inform VIA University College of this on email <u>apply@via.dk</u>
